Contractual Arrangements:

- After five years, Kettering and Centerville School Districts need to reassess the status of the **Planning District Contract.**
- Kettering has 14 programs v. 11 programs at Centerville so they are designated as the lead district.
- The lead district is also designated as the fiscal agent.
- The fee for participation in a district other than the home school district is \$500.00 / student.
- CTE services will be provided for a minimum of two students per each member district per unduplicated courses.
- Sending districts are responsible for transporting students to programs outside their district.



WBL Coordinator Responsibilities:

- Develop relationships with Business Partners setting up Work-Based Learning **Opportunities such as:**
 - **Off-Site Placement and Internships**
 - Entrepreneurships
 - School-based Enterprise
 - Simulated Work Environment

Goal = 15% of students in a program earn 250 WBL Hours



WBL Coordinator Responsibilities cont'd:

- Work with Business and Industry Partners to navigate the SB 166 Tax Credit Certificate program.
- Track WBL Employer Agreements & WBL work hours.

 - Conduct "Mock" Interviews
 - Assist with the Onboarding Process
